Lot 7, Block 7, South Side Addition to the City of Alpena and that parcel of land commencing at the South Line of Fifth Street and the West boundary of South Side Addition, City of Alpena, Michigan; thence South 31 degrees 07 minutes West 28.6 feet to

the point of beginning; thence North 58 degrees 31 minutes West 301.0 feet; thence South 30 degrees 57 minutes West 715.8 feet thence South 65 degrees 23 minutes East 300.84 feet; thence North 31 degrees 7 minutes East 679.75 feet, less beginning at the South line of Fourth Street and the West boundary of the South Side Addition to the City of Alpena; thence North 85 degrees 27 minutes West, 38.0 feet; thence South 4 degrees 33 minutes West 75.99 feet; thence North 31 degrees 07 minutes East 84.96 feet to the point of beginning, all being a part of the Northeast Quarter of Section 28, Town 31 North, Range 8 East.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any surplus portions of this property will be conveyed by the City to purchasers, pursuant to provisions of the City Charter, at the request of the Commission and the monies secured thereby will be used to reduce the acquisition cost of the site.
