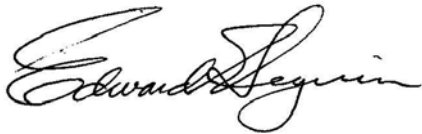

PLUMBING RULES AND REGULATION

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Thomas, and seconded by Councilman Neumann:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1-64 Article VI of Chapter I of the Code of the City of Alpena, the Board of Plumbing, at a meeting held January 14, 1964, adopted a resolution providing minimum requirements for individual sewage disposal systems as follows:

INDIVIDUAL SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS, MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Every individual sewage disposal system shall consist of a house sewer, a septic tank and an acceptable absorption system (subsurface absorption field or subsurface absorption bed.)

Location and installation of the system shall be such that with reasonable maintenance it will function in a sanitary manner and will not create a nuisance, health hazard or endanger the safety of any domestic water supply.

The system shall provide the minimum safe distances as shown in table 1. A.

Installations in low swampy areas, areas with a high water table (permanent fluctuating or seasonal) areas with ledge rock or areas which are subject to flooding are not acceptable.

The system shall be designed to and shall receive all sanitary sewage (bathroom, kitchen and laundry) from the

dwelling. Footing or roof drainage shall not enter any part of the system.

The house sewer shall have watertight joints. It shall be on a grade of not less than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch per foot. Ells or bends of 90 degrees will not be acceptable. Cleanouts shall be installed in accordance with the State Plumbing Code.

SEPTIC TANK

Design shall provide adequate volume for settling, for sludge and scum storage and access for cleaning.

Liquid capacity shall be based on the number of bedrooms proposed, or that can be reasonably anticipated in the dwelling and shall be at least that shown in table 2.A.

The liquid depth of the tank shall not be less than 48 inches. A liquid depth greater than 6 feet shall not be considered in determining the tank capacity.

The outlet connections of the tank and of each compartment thereof shall be submerged or baffled to obtain effective retention of scum and sludge.

Scum storage volume (space between the liquid surface and the top of the inlet or outlet devices) shall not be less than 15 per cent of the required liquid capacity.

Outlet baffles including pipe used as baffles shall extend below the liquid surface a distance equal to approximately 40 per cent of the liquid depth of the tank. They shall extend upward to within two inches of the tank cover. The outlet invert shall be at least two inches below the inlet.

Access to the tank shall be provided through properly placed manholes or by an easily removed cover. There shall be provided sufficient cover over the top of the tank to permit grass growth and to control odors. Minimum depth below

finish grade 4 inches.

SUBSURFACE ABSORPTION

FIELD:

Location of the absorption field shall be in an unobstructed area and shall comply with the minimum distances given in table 1. A.

Minimum absorption area (total bottom area of trenches) of the absorption field shall be determined from the results of percolation tests conducted in accordance with standard practices. The trench bottom area shall be determined from table 3.A.

Tile lines shall be spaced in accordance with table 4.A.

That portion of an absorption trench below the top of the distribution pipe shall be in natural or acceptably stabilized earth. All trenches in an absorption field shall comply with table 5.A.

In locations where the slope of the ground over the absorption field area is relatively flat the trenches shall be connected to produce a continuous system and the trench bottoms shall be

In locations where the ground over the absorption area slopes greater than six inches a system of serial distribution trenches following the contours of the land may be used. The trenches will be installed at different elevations, but the bottom of each individual trench shall be level. Trenches shall be connected with a watertight overflow line in such a manner that a trench will be filled to the depth of the gravel before the sewage flows to the next lower trench.

Affluent from, the septic tank to the absorption field shall be conducted through a watertight line with a grade of at least $\frac{1}{4}$ inch per foot. Tees, wyes or other distributing devices may be

used.

Tile used in the absorption field shall be spaced no more than $\frac{1}{4}$ inch apart. All open joints shall be protected from soil infiltration. Filter material may vary from $\frac{3}{4}$ inch to $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch and shall be free from fines, dust, sand or clay, the filter material shall completely encase the tile.

A barrier such as straw may be placed over the filter material so as to prevent infiltration of backfill material.

ABSORPTION BEDS:

Use of absorption beds with a septic tank is acceptable only when necessary because of soil conditions or topography, as determined by the Health Officer.

Location of absorption beds shall comply with the minimum distances shown in table 1. A.

Effective absorption area of a absorption area bed shall be calculated as bottom area. Total bottom absorption area shall be determined from table &A. using results of percolation tests.

The bottom of the absorption bed shall terminate in a porous formation at least 4 feet in thickness.

No bed excavation shall extend into the water table. Where ground water is encountered, the bottom of the bed shall be raised with filter material at least 2 feet above the water table.

The construction of the absorption bed shall comply to table 7.A.

An effective barrier shall be provided between the filter material and the backfill.

Minimum liquid capacity below outlet invert (gallons).

Moved by Councilman Neumann, seconded by Councilman Nowak, that Ordinance No. 39, being an Ordinance authorizing the construction of additions and improvements to the water supply system of the City of Alpena; to provide for the issuance and sale of revenue bonds to pay part of the cost thereof; to provide for the fixing, collection, segregation and disposition of the revenues of said water supply system and payment of said bonds out of the revenues thereof; and creating a statutory lien on

said revenues, does now pass.

Carried by vote as follows:

Ayes: Crow, Neumann, Nowak, Thomas, and Weinkauf.

Nays: None.

NOTICE OF SALE

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Councilman Thomas and supported by Councilman Crow:

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena, County of Alpena, Michigan, by an Ordinance duly adopted on December 21, 1964, authorized the issuance and sale of Four Hundred Eighty Thousand (\$480,000.00) Dollars Water Supply System Revenue Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City Clerk make application to the Municipal Finance Commission for an order approving the issuance and sale of said bonds and the form of notice of sale.

2. The City Clerk shall cause notice of sale of said bonds to be published in the Michigan Investor, of Detroit, Michigan at least fourteen (14) full days before the date fixed for sale.

3. The Notice of Sale shall be in substantially the following form:

Sealed bids for the purchase of the above bonds will be received by the undersigned at the City Hall in said City until 7:30 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, on _____, the _____ day of _____,

1965, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said bonds will be dated February 1, 1965, will be coupon bonds in the denomination of either \$1,000.00 each or \$5,000.00 each, at the option of the purchaser, will be numbered consecutively in direct order of their maturities from 1 upwards, will be registrable as to principal only and will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding five per cent (5%) per annum, expressed in multiples of $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1 - The Minimum interest rate bid shall be not less than two per cent (2). Said interest will be payable on July 1, 1965, and semiannually thereafter on January 1st and July 1st of each year. The interest rate on any one bond will be at one rate only and each coupon period shall be represented by one interest coupon. Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company qualified by law to act as such paying agent, to be designated by the purchaser of the bonds who may also designate a co - paying agent. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of the bonds shall be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery. The bonds will mature serially as follows:

\$40,000 July 1st of each year from 1966 to 1977, inclusive.

Outstanding bonds of this issue may be called for redemption as a whole or in part on any interest payment date on or after July 1, 1974. Bonds so called for redemption shall be redeemed at par and accrued interest to the date of redemption plus a premium as follows:

1% of par value on each bond called for redemption prior to July 1, 1975; $\frac{1}{2}$ % of par value on each bond called for redemption on or after July 1, 1975, but prior to maturity.

Thirty days' notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given by publication in a paper circulated in the State of Michigan which carries, as part of its regular service, notices of sale of municipal bonds, and in case of registered bonds, thirty days' notice shall be given by mail to the

registered address. Bonds so called for redemption, provided funds are interest after the date fixed for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem said bonds.

The bonds are to be issued under Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1.933, as amended, and under an Ordinance of the City of Alpena for the purpose of paying part of the cost of constructing additions and improvements to the Water Supply System of the City. The bonds will not be a general obligation of the City but will be payable solely from the net revenues of the Water Supply System of the City, and for the payment of principal and interest on said bonds and on any additional bonds of equal standing issued pursuant to the terms of said Ordinance, a statutory first lien has been created on the net revenues of the System, including any additions, extensions and improvements thereto.

Additional bonds of equal standing with the bonds of this issue may be issued, but only for the purposes and on the terms and conditions expressed in the authorizing Ordinance. For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from (herein insert the first day of the month next following the date of receiving bids, or the date of the bonds, whichever is later) to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the City.

No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds, or at a price less than their par value, will be considered.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$9,600.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the City Treasurer of the City of Alpena, must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such-bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest will be allowed on the good faith checks, and checks of

unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, which opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof and which opinion will be printed on the reverse side of each bond. The City shall pay the cost of printing the bonds. Executed bonds will be delivered to the purchaser without expense. Bonds will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan, or at such other place as may be agreed upon with the purchaser, and will be accompanied by the usual closing documents, including a certificate that no litigation is pending affecting the issuance of said bonds.

The right is reserved to reject any or all bids. Envelopes containing the bids should be plainly marked "Proposal for Bonds."
