

# What are you doing with your unused medications?

## Two options to dispose of unused medications....



### Drug Take Back Program

Sponsored by the North Dakota Attorney General

#### ACCEPTED:

Unused or expired medicines, prescription or over-the-counter, including

- Pills, tablets, caplets
- Inhalers, nebulizer solutions
- Liquid medicines - any amount (leave in container)

- **PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, INCLUDING CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES:**

- **Pain relief**, such as Vicodin, hydrocodone, oxycontin, fentanyl, demerol
- **Anti depressants**, such as Valium Zoloft, Prozac, Cymbalta
- **Sleep aids**, such as Ambien, Lunesta, Sonata

- To safeguard patient confidentiality, **PRODUCT SHOULD BE REMOVED FROM THE CONTAINER.**

Unused prescription drugs can be disposed of safely by depositing them in the **secure disposal container**, located in the lobby of the police department in the participating cities. No questions asked:

- Grand Forks
- Fargo
- West Fargo
- Bismarck
- Minot

#### ACCEPTED:

Unused or expired medicines, prescription or over-the-counter, including

- Pills, tablets, caplets
- Ointments, creams, lotions and powders
- Inhalers, nebulizer solutions
- Liquid medicines  $\leq$  4 oz.

- **PRODUCTS SHOULD BE LEFT IN THE PACKAGING IT WAS DISPENSED IN.**

**NOT ACCEPTED BY THIS PROGRAM:** Controlled substances, such as: Adderall, Vicodin, Demerol, Hydrocodone, MS Contin, Ambien and others. Please deposit **controlled substances** in the **TAKE BACK containers at participating police departments.**

**MEDICATIONS MAY BE DEPOSITED IN THE PHARMACY DROP BOX.**

**NOT ACCEPTED BY EITHER PROGRAM:** Any sharps (such as syringes, lancets), thermometers, glass, home based care (HBC) or durable medical equipment (DME) supplies. Ask your pharmacist where to safely dispose of these items. Inventory from a pharmacy or other healthcare facility is NOT acceptable.
